Shaquora is also known for her crochet items and she uses poetry and prose to describe her many works of art! Her artistic range is limitless and there are so many more unique gifts that the world will learn, discover and find! Shaquora's work was recently featured in Hulu original series, *Kindred*, based on the book by Octavia Butler.





MADAM C.J. WALKER

Entrepreneur

Madam C.J. Walker (born Sarah Breedlove; December 23, 1867 – May 25, 1919, near Delta, Louisiana) was an **African American entrepreneur, philanthropist, and political and social activist**. She is recorded as the **first female self-made millionaire in America** in the Guinness Book of World Records.

Walker made her fortune by developing and marketing a line of cosmetics and hair care products for black women through the business she founded, Madam C. J. Walker Manufacturing Company. She became known also for her philanthropy and activism. She made financial donations to numerous organizations such as the NAACP, and became a patron of the arts.

Villa Lewaro, Walker's lavish estate in Irvington, New York, served as a social gathering place for the African-American community. She was considered the wealthiest African-American businesswoman and wealthiest self-made black woman in America at the time.





ELLA FITZGERALD


Jazz Singer

Ella Jane Fitzgerald (April 25, 1917 – June 15, 1996; born in Newport News, Virginia) was a **Black American jazz singer**, sometimes **referred to as the "First Lady of Song"**, **"Queen of Jazz"**, and **"Lady Ella"**.

She was noted for her purity of tone, impeccable diction, phrasing, timing, intonation, and a "horn-like" improvisational ability, particularly in her scat singing. She performed across the country but most often associated with the Savoy Ballroom in Harlem.

While Fitzgerald appeared in films and as a guest on popular television shows in the second half of the twentieth century, her musical collaborations with Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington, and The Ink Spots were some of her most notable acts outside of her solo career.





MUHAMMAD ALI



Professional Boxer


Muhammad Ali (born Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr.; January 17, 1942 – June 3, 2016; born in Louisville, Kentucky) was an American professional boxer and activist.

Nicknamed "The Greatest", he is regarded as one of the most significant sports figures of the 20th century and is frequently ranked as the greatest heavyweight boxer of all time.

He began training as an amateur boxer at age 12. At 18, he won a gold medal in the light heavyweight division at the 1960 Summer Olympics and turned professional later that year. He became a Muslim after 1961.


He won the world heavyweight championship, defeating Sonny Liston in a major upset on February 25, 1964, at age 22. During that year, he denounced his birth name as a slave name and formally changed his name to Muhammad Ali. In 1966, Ali refused to be drafted into the military because of religious beliefs and ethical opposition to the Vietnam War. He was found guilty of draft evasion and stripped of his boxing titles. He stayed out of prison and appealed the decision to the Supreme Court. His conviction was overturned in 1971. His actions as an objector to the Vietnam War made him an icon for the larger counterculture of the 1960s generation and he was a very high-profile figure during the civil rights movement and throughout his career.







- 5. Share your model with someone you trust.







